### DATA USAGE Please Note!

Individuals using this data to estimate the number of jobs that exist for a specific DOT job title should incorporate local knowledge of the labor market . It is virtually impossible to estimate precisely how many jobs of a specific DOT title exist in a labor market without reconnaissance of all employers that hire such workers. Therefore it is more prudent to use a range for estimating rather than a specific number.

Some individual DOT job titles should be given less weight than others based on how estoteric the title is. This information along with personal knowledge of the labor market can be used to make judgements about the prominence of a particular title.
